Local News and Updates

On Saturday 10th February 2026, a male was traced, arrested and reported for series of vehicle thefts in 2025, one of which was a Range Rover Vogue that cost the registered keeper £17,500.00 at time of purchase. The vehicle was involved in a collision whilst the accused made off from the scene and as such was charged with failure to report the accident and failure to stop after same, as well as the thefts.

Two school pupils have been charged with vandalism and culpable and reckless conduct for amassing approximately £1,000.00 of damage, caused by throwing stones at cars within Blairgowrie High School's carpark. The two school pupils have been reported to the Youth Justice Assessor for their consideration.

On Friday 6th February 2026 a female was charged with culpable and reckless fire-raising, starting a fire within the living area of her property and barricading the door to attempt to block emergency services' entry. The fire was brought under control and the block evacuated by officers until SFRS attended. The female has been reported to the Procurator Fiscal for their consideration.

A female has been arrested and charged for driving a vehicle whilst over the limit. The female provided specimens of breath, results of which were 126 microgrammes, almost six times over the limit. The female was reported to the Procurator Fiscal for their consideration.

A male has reported a theft of tools from his garden shed, in Crieff, whereby the hinges of the door had been cut through and a petrol chainsaw taken from within. Enquiries are ongoing at this time.

There have been several reports of bus shelters having been vandalised by an air rifle causing the glass to shatter. The initial report of vandalism took place in Murthly. This matter is currently being investigated.

A male has been issued with 3 points and £100 for careless driving on the A9 southbound at the junction of A824 Auchterarder, for pulling into the path of another vehicle making contact and causing it to take evasive action onto the verge. Traffic officers attended, closing the lane and ticket issued to the driver of the vehicle in question.

In 2025, three remote control cars had been stolen from a van in Perth. Following enquiries from officers that had been ongoing since the initial report, a report was received from Cash Converters that property had been traded in matching the description of the stolen property. As such a male was traced, arrested and charged for reset (selling on stolen property, with the knowledge that the property was stolen) The male was reported for the consideration of the Procurator Fiscal.
