Local News and Updates

A female has been issued with a Recorded Police Warning for vandalising a neighbour's property in Dunkeld, namely spray painting the neighbouring garden fence with fluorescent orange paint. As such, the female was dealt with accordingly.

On Thursday 5th March, Crieff Road, Perth, a male was stopped by road policing officers having been observed riding an electric scooter on a public footpath. It is a crime to use electric scooters anywhere unless it is private land with the owner's consent. During the stop, it was revealed that the male was a disqualified driver and had no valid policy of insurance in place. As such, the electric scooter was seized, and the male was reported to the Procurator Fiscal for their consideration.

A large flat stove top grill was stolen from The Scottish Deli, Dunkeld, valued at £3000.00. The grill had been awaiting uplift for repairs. At this time, enquiries continue.

A vehicle was stopped by road policing officers on Tay Street, Perth, having observed a 3 year old child standing up in the middle rear seat whilst driving. Officers found the child completely insecure in the car seat, which too was insecure. Whilst carrying out checks, it was revealed that the male was driving on a ghost record that had 10 live points and no insurance with which to drive the vehicle in question. The male was reported to the Procurator Fiscal for their consideration.

Two out board boat engines, various boat and car parts, tools, garden equipment and a sage coffee machine have been stolen following a house breaking from a barn on a property in Glenalmond. At this time, enquiries continue.

Two males have been charged with attempt to pervert the course of justice, driving a vehicle while over 10 microgrammes of cocaine per litre of blood and driving with a provisional licence and no learner plates whilst unaccompanied. The males have been reported to the Procurator Fiscal for their consideration, following a routine traffic stop by road policing officers on Edinburgh Road, Perth.

An investigation is currently underway following a hoax bomb threat made to Perth High School. The suspect is believed to be a male youth.

While carrying out a static road patrol in Kinross, road policing officers observed a vehicle travelling at speeds in excess of the 40 mph limit. Using a speed detection device, road traffic officers captured the vehicle travelling at 81 mph. The male driving the vehicle was charged and has been reported to the Procurator Fiscal for their consideration.

Two suspects, described as white male youths between the ages of 12-14, wearing all dark clothing are currently wanted in connection with culpable and reckless conduct. A vehicle's windscreen was severely damaged whilst travelling northbound under the dual carriageway footbridge on the A9 bypass, Perth. The two youths are believed to have been throwing stones onto oncoming vehicles.

£2000.00 worth of power tools have been stolen from a R W Bell Contractors van whilst carrying out work at The House of Bruar, Blair Atholl. Reports had been made to the concierge at The House of Bruar of suspicious persons trying doors of parked vehicles. The investigation is ongoing at this time.

A female was issued with 3 penalty points and £100.00 fine by traffic officers for stopping within the limits of a Puffin Crossing on Glasgow Road, Perth.
